Chapter 7: GLF Leaves U of R Campus, Gay Alliance Begins 4:35

From these beginnings, Gay Liberation became a focal point of political activism. Rochesterians who were not students at the University became involved in the organization, and were the majority of active members. The University stopped funding the GLF because they no longer considered it a student group, run by students. Thus in 1973, the GLF morphed into the Gay Alliance of the Genesee Valley.
